# Oregon golfers stand 10th in 15-team tournament

The Oregon women's golf team stands in 10th place after the first day of the Edean Ihlandfelt Invitational held at the Sahalie Country Club in Renton, Wash., Monday.

The Ducks fired a team score of 342 for the day to finish 10th out of 15 schools in the Invitational. Oregon's Leigh Hornung was tied for 15th place overall with a first-round eightover par 80. She is seven strokes off the lead held by Audrey Wooding of Stanford who carded a 73

While Hornung had a good first-day, the other Duck duffers didn't fare nearly as well.

Shannon Maier shot an 85 to tie for 40th place while Starla Yamada was eight strokes back at 88 and tied for 58th overall. Beth Manczak fired an 89 to tie

for the Ducks, tying for 64th.

Stanford was the first-day team leader as the Cardinal fired a 306 while Oklahoma was next at 310 followed by host Washington which recorded a 319.

While Wooding paced the individual competition. Oklahoma had three golfers tied for second with Beth Brown, Ellen Mielke and Alyoya Rambin all carding 76s. Stanford's Jodi Figley was also tied for second.

Schools from around the west coast and elsewhere are competing in the three-day tournament which continues today and will conclude on Wednesday. Several other schools in the tournament include Kansas, Brigham Young, Hawaii, Long Beach State, and New Mexico.

## Ducks fall out of Top 25 poll

Oregon's football dropped out of the Associated Press Top 25 poll on Monday. following a 38-17 loss to Washington last Saturday.

The Ducks were ranked 19th going into the game against Washington who was ranked 17th. The Huskies moved up to the No. 13 spot but Oregon fell out of the poll to the 27th spot with 83 votes. The Ducks would have needed 33 more votes to tie Texas A & M for the 25th slot.

Virginia takes over the No. 1 spot this week after Michigan, the previous No. 1, fell to cross-state rival Michigan State. The Cavaliers were ranked No. 2 last week.

Virginia and Georgia Tech. which jumped up from No. 18 to No. 11, are on a collision course to meet for the Atlantic Coast Conference championship, a game that looks like it could decide the national championship, or have major bearings on this year's No. 1
