to real people," Wickizer said.

"The bigots who have money better understand that because this case is going to be seen as a precedent," he said.

Fidanque said the jury found Metzger's role in the killing to be more than an exercise in free speech. Attorneys for Seraw originally charged that Metzger

was reckless by advocating racial separatism.

However, those charges and others were dropped from the suit because of conflicts with protected free expression, so jurors ruled only on evidence relating to Metzger's inciting violence, Fidanque said.
