

## Stanford comes into town looking for upset

In the last three years, no team has been more successful against Oregon than Stanford

Three years ago the Ducks were 4-2 and headed to Stanford with bowl aspirations, only to have those ruined when the Cardinal

Two years ago the Ducks did win, by a 7-3 count at Autzen Stadium, but Oregon lost a 17-0 lead last year at Stanford as the Cardinal scored 18 points in the final seven-and-a-half minutes to beat Oregon 18-17.

This year Oregon Coach Rich Brooks is expecting another close game, although the Ducks (5-2 and ranked 25th this week) and Stanford (2-5) are heading in op-

'I think it's just been a competi tive series." Brooks said. "I think Stanford is an excellent football team, and I'm sure they're going to come up here and play a heck of a football game.'

The Cardinal was crushed 52-16 last week by Washington, but pulled off the upset of the year three weeks ago when they beat then-No. 1 Notre Dame 36-31 in South Bend, Ind. The Cardinal also had Colorado on the ropes before losing 21-17 and played well in losing to USC 37-22.

But the Cardinal has also been inconsistent, losing a one-point game to UCLA and dropping a 29-23 game to San Jose State the week before the Notre Dame victo-

"I don't think anybody could be proud of a 2-5 record." Stanford Coach Denny Green said. "All we want to do is play well and finish strong. Our guys have shown that they can play some good football. but we need to show some consis-

Largely because of the offensive firepower Green has, this year's Stanford team, despite its inconsistency, is a better one than last year's squad that went 3-8.

Quarterback Jason Palumbis, from Lake Oswego's Lakeridge High School, is completing 68.4 percent of his passes and leads the Pacific-10 Conference in quarterback efficiency rating. He has also







