Ducks hope to secure fourth place

The Oregon volleyball team could make some important moves in the Pacific-10 Conference race this weekend when USC and UCLA visit McArthur Court.

The Ducks (14-7, 5-5) need at least one victory this weekend to stay in fourth place in the conference. Oregon is in sole possession of fourth place but USC and Arizona are just behind with records of 5-6 in conference play.

"This weekend is really the key to fourth place for us," said Oregon coach Gerry Gregory. "Right now it is a three-way race between us, USC, and Arizona. Or, if Oregon State falters we could overtake them (for third place)."

With top-ranked UCLA coming to town Saturday night, Or-

egon is focusing most of its attention on the Friday night match against USC, a team the Ducks beat earlier in the season. Both matches start at 7:30 p.m.

"UCLA is a fun team to play against because we have nothing to lose." Gregory said "They can bring the best out in a team, but they have no reason to be scared of us unless we are at the top of our game.

"We play USC first and they are the focus of our attention this weekend," he said.

Oregon defeated USC 16-14, 12-15, 15-12, 15-13 in the first match between the two teams this season on Sept. 29. If that match is any indication, this
