Streaks on line as Ducks and Bruins battle

One of two streaks will be broken Saturday at Autzen Sta-

UCLA, which has never lost in seven tries at Autzen, faces No. 22 Oregon, unbeaten in six games at home this year and winners of eight straight there.

The Ducks have never finished a season unbeaten at home since Autzen was built in 1967, and Oregon Coach Rich Brooks has his best chance ever when the two teams square off at 1 p.m.

"Until about three or four years ago I don't think playing at home was that big of a difference to us." Brooks said. "We didn't have what you'd call a home field advantage.

'Our crowd has become nore vocal, larger as well as vocal, and I think that gives us a better advantage at home now," he said.

Brooks said despite losing seven straight at home to the Bruins, he doesn't believe in

"They've had better football teams for the most part than we have had during that stretch." Brooks said. "I think it's been a thing where UCLA was clearly the dominant football team.

have to end and I just as soon it end this year, but if not this year. I'm sure it will end somewhere in the future," he said.

The Ducks had their best chance of ending that streak two years ago before an ABC-TV national audience, but Brian Brown broke a 69-yard run late in the game to lead the Bruins to a 16-6 win.

Oregon was without quarterback Bill Musgrave that game. but the Duck defense held down UCLA's Troy Aikmenpowered offense all day until they were burned on Brown's big play.


Brooks isn't looking forward to again facing Brown, now a senior, especially after he has rushed for more than 100 yards in four of UCLA's last five

"I think Brian Brown is a very good instinctive runner," Brooks said. "I think he's a big play kind of a back."

The Bruins are coming in at 3-2 in Pacific-10 Conference play and 4-4 overall, and although it isn't the same UCLA team that went to eight straight bowl games between 1981 and 1988 and won seven of them over that span, it is a much better team than the one that was 3-7-1 a year ago.

A big reason for that has been the re-emergence of Brown and the play of redshirt freshman Tommy Maddox at quarterOPEN DAIL

Maddox is second to Musgrave in the Pac-10 in total offense and has thrown for 1,702 vards and nine touchdowns. 'Maddox is just a tremen-

dous talent." Brooks said. "He's got great arm speed, he has real good mobility. (and) he's running the option extremely well.

"I think he's one of the best quarterbacks in the nation even right now," he said, "and certainly in the next three years he's going to be a dominating factor for UCLA."

The Ducks, however, have other things to worry about besides Brown and Maddox.


At 2-2 in the Pac-10 and 6-2 overall, the Ducks are now in a three-game stretch drive that could have them playing in back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history.

Three wins would allow Oregon to choose from several bowls, and a nine-win season would be the first since 1948.

It's also the last home game for 22 seniors, although flankers Tony Hargain and Michael
