## Marxism talks planned

Three-part series examines future

The University's Humanities Center will host a series of lectures, beginning today, to debate the future of communism.

Titled "Is Marxism Obsolete?" the event will consist of three lectures and is cosponsored by Lane County League of Women Voters and the Eugene/Springfield Solidarity Network.

"We were asked to sponsor by the Humanities Center," said Sue Girardeau, league president. "They said it was good to have an outside group involved."

The lectures were made possible by a grant from the Oregon Committee of Humanities, an affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities. The Northwest Conference on Philosophy has given addition-

al support.

"This topic does interest us," Girardeau said. "We're glad we were asked. It's nice to be involved with the University."

The first lecture, beginning at 8 p.m. tonight in the EMU Gumwood Room, is entitled "Human Rights and Nationality Rights: Marxist-Leninist Theory and Soviet Practice," and will be given by Jim Nickel of the University of Colorado.

"Analytical Marxism and the Crisis of Socialism," is Saturday morning's lecture and will begin at 11:30 in the EMU Gumwood Room. Kai Nielsen from the University of Calgary will give the speech.

The final lecture of the series is "What Is To Be Done?" and will be given by University associate philosophy professor Cheyney Ryan. Her speech starts at 4 p.m. Saturday, again in the EMU Gumwood Room.

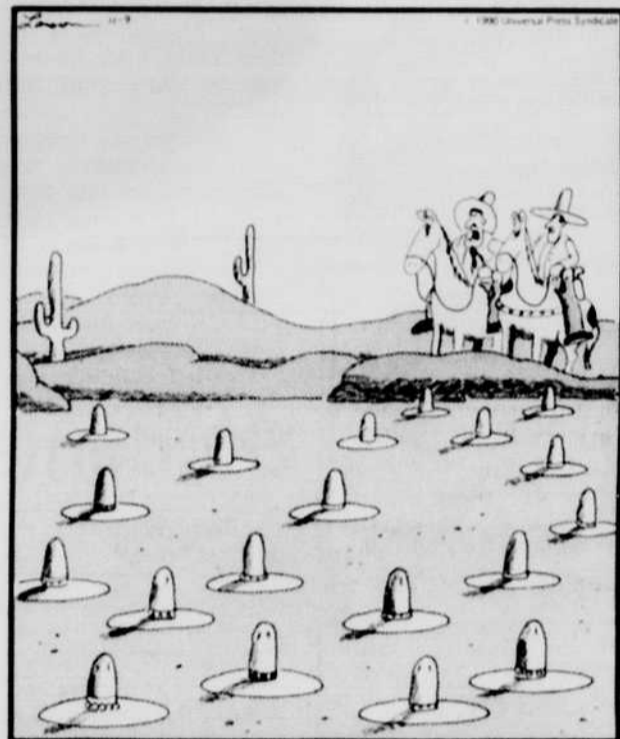
