Groups miss funding date

Six student groups will not be funded by student fees next year because they did not submit 1991-92 budgets by Thursday's deadline

The groups that were zero-funded for 1991-92 are: American Society for Interior Design, Big Time Poetry Theatre, International Studies Association, Oregon Pre-Health Students Association, Telecommunication and Film Association and UO Song and

All six fell under IFC Resolution 12, stating that groups that fail to submit a budget by the deadline without proper prior notification will not be funded.

The deadline for organizations requesting more than \$5,000 is

Although the zero-funded groups technically have no recourse to appeal the denial of funds, Resolution 12 leaves a loophole that at least one organization may exercise. IFC Chairman Mike Colson

The Student Insurgent missed the Thursday deadline but may submit a request for more than \$5,000 by Dec. 6 so it can continue receiving IFC funds, Colson said.


Colson said the loophole was unintended and that the IFC may consider amending the resolution to prevent such a move in the future.
