marks could have 15 hours worth removed.

With the new GPA system. students with 2.00 averages cannot graduate, and those with 2.00 averages on academic probation cannot continue school without the permission of the Scholastic Review Committee

Students who are disqualified for academic performance for any reason can appeal to the committee, chaired by Greg Kerber, assistant journalism school dean. Kerber said the committee has always used the 15-credit rule when hearing petitions from students in danger of not graduating or failing out of school.

Kerber said nothing with regard to N's and F's has really changed, and departments have been counting no-pass grades as failing ones in their own averages since 1978.

"This is all legislation that was enacted by the faculty a long time ago," he said.

When asked if he believed the counting of N's as F's was unfair. Kerber said the pass/nopass option was never intended to safeguard a student's GPA from the effects of a failing grade.

"Originally, students would use the pass/no-pass to avoid getting C's," he said. "The option is to encourage you to go out of your major and try something new.


