groups is marginal or blocked.

Racial stereotypes persist. Marabel said, and often being recognized as part of a racial minority says something about the individual, and about his or her language, class and culture. Being white, however, does not carry that stereotype.

'To be white in the U.S. says nothing about an individual." Marabel said. "White culture does not exist. White privilege and white power does exist.

'Any white person usually finds it much easier to establish credit or buy a home than any non-white person. Blackness in racial terms still means a hundred different insults every day.

As the dominators, the whites in this country have created a facade of racial justice.


