IFC hears YWCA plea; votes against artists

The Incidental Fee Committee voted 4-1-1 Tuesday night to allow the YWCA to submit its budget late because the organization's computer broke down the morning of Nov. 15, the day the budget was due.

The American Institute of Graphic Artists will remain zero-funded, however, because group members not only failed to submit a budget on time but did not appear at Tuesday's meeting to explain their request for a deadline extension.

The IFC also voted unanimously to allow a student group to receive IFC funding after just one year of recognition by the ASUO, though each group must also prove to the IFC that it continues to provide for the physical and cultural development of the University student body.

Also included in this resolution is a clause stating that

first-year funding cannot exceed \$300.

At the Nov. 21 IFC meeting, the group voted to allow the EMU and the Intercollegiate Athletics Department to submit their budgets after the required deadline because the two groups operate on a fiscal year that is different from other student groups.

Another IFC meeting is scheduled for 4 p.m. today. The IFC will hear from Student Bar Association, which did not submit its budget on time, and will vote on a special funding request from the Student Senate.

Budget hearings for the 1990-91 school year also begin today with the Literary Society, Amazon Community Tenants, Students for the Ethical Treatment of Animals and Campus Exchange Information.

Student groups requesting more than \$5,000 must submit their budgets by Thursday, Dec. 6.

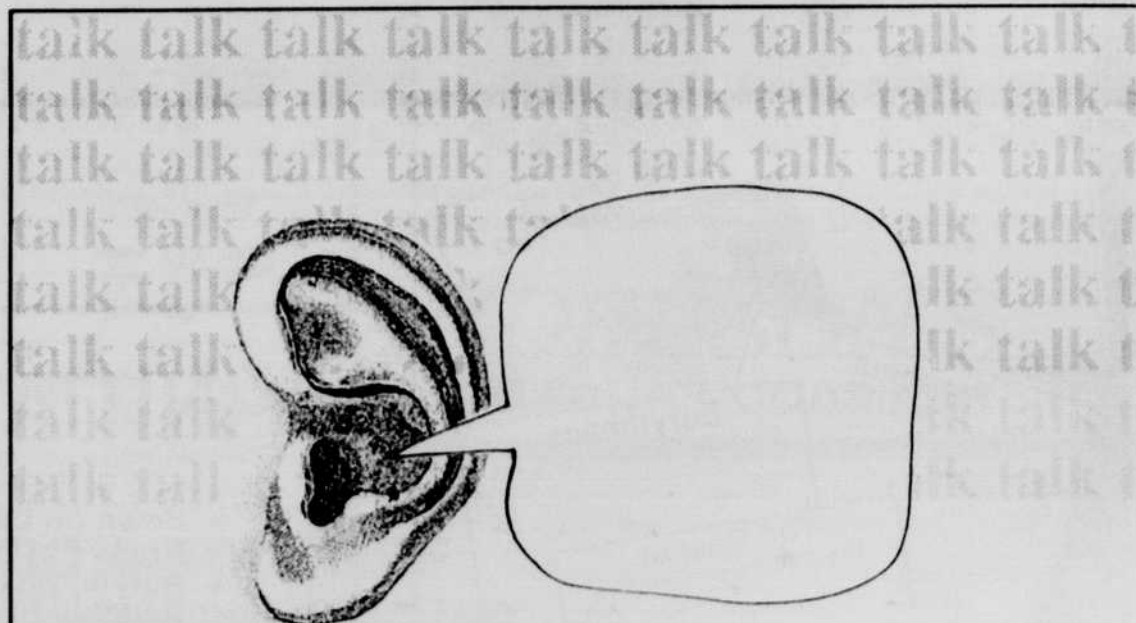
