Meanwhile, back at home. Kevin enjoys the freedom about which most kids can only dream. He eats mounds of ice cream for dinner, watches offlimits videos and explores unknown domains - including his brother's private stash.

He even gets to ride his sleigh down the stairs through the doorway. Surprisingly, he also becomes very domestic. washing laundry and showering himself, being sure to reach all his crevices.


But can he defend his home from two inane burglars making their holiday score? Taking the Rambo role, Kevin sets out to defend his home with innovative boobie traps.
