## Glenn leads wrestlers with fifth-place showing

Scott Glenn's fifth-place finish led the Oregon wrestling team to a tie for 21st at the Las Vegas Invitational this past weekend.

Glenn, wrestling in the 142-pound class, was the only Duck wrestler who had a good showing at the tournament, which annually brings together the top wrestling teams in the nation.

Glenn won three of four matches on Friday, but the one loss dropped him into the consolation bracket.

On Saturday, Glenn won three of four matches to take the fifth-place title with a 3-1 victory over Jeff Lyons of Indiana.

Glenn opened Saturday's competition

by beating Jamie Boyd of Notre Dame (4-2) and Jon Pierro of Fresno State (6-1). In his next match, Glenn lost 4-2 to Clemson's Jim Carazola in an attempt to reach the consolation title match, but did come back to defeat Lyons for fifth.

Glenn and heavyweight Cam Strahm were the only two Duck wrestlers to make it to Saturday's round

Strahm lost his first match on Friday, but came back to post two more wins to advance in the consolation rounds to Saturday's competition. However, Strahm lost 8-0 to Michigan's Phil Tomek in his first match Saturday to be eliminated from the competition.
