From finding the future pulse of Oregon's timber and salmon conflicts to trying to ease Ballot Measure 5's tax-limitation effect on the state's financial horizon. Whitelaw said his tasks are full of "classic trade-offs."

Measure 5, the initiative that will limit local property taxes and require an extra \$620 million from the state's

and in 1991-92, has made Whitelaw's job "clearly more difficult," he said.


"It's the classic trade-off between roads and sewers for cities and counties, and child care and health care programs, for instance," he said. "What kind of criteria do you use to make those kinds of trade offs? Evervone has strong feelings and priorities about all of the different programs and services.

Whitelaw, who also heads a Eugene-based financial consulting firm, said Dec. 21 has emerged as a "major date" that the team is shooting for, hoping by then to have their budget recommendations developed into a firm package for Roberts.

But all of this political hubbub is nothing new for this professor. Whitelaw's involvement in politics dates back to working on one of Roberts' campaigns for her present position of secretary of state and helping out Gov. Neil Goldschmidt's transition team four years ago.

With so many irons in the political fire, is this professor a career politician in the making?

Definitely not, Whitelaw said. "I'm not interested in a political position; I have already expressed that. There is an absolute limit to this period of time.
