recommendations on her road map for the next six months and into the the next four years," said team coordinator John Keyser.

"This is really exciting stuff," said Whitelaw of his volunteer position, even if it is "absolutely time consuming."

Whitelaw said his job as head of the economic development, rural development and transportation team gives him the chance to put into practice his 23 years of teaching urban economics and economics of the Pacific Northwest at the University.

"In the large picture of things, this might seem like mundane stuff," he said, "but it will affect the bulk of what Oregon looks like in Portland and along the I-5 Corridor for the next 50 years."

"I find that terribly exciting."

The transition team is a hub of nine groups that specialize in specific areas of policy analysis and formation for Roberts, who will be sworn in as Oregon's governor Jan. 14.

The team's short-term challenge is "to get ready for the next legislative session, to help

prepare the budget, and to build a team that will be as effective as possible in the next six months," Keyser said.

Whitelaw, who is on leave this year from the University, said it involves dealing with a list of touchy state-wide topics.

From finding the future pulse of Oregon's timber and salmon conflicts to trying to ease Ballot Measure 5's tax-limitation effect on the state's financial horizon, Whitelaw said his tasks are full of "classic trade-offs."

Measure 5, the initiative that will limit local property taxes and require an extra \$620 million from the state's general

fund in 1991-92, has made Whitelaw's job "clearly more difficult," he said.

"It's the classic trade-off between roads and sewers for cities and counties, and child care and health care programs, for instance," he said. "What kind of criteria do you use to make those kinds of trade offs? Everyone has strong feelings and priorities about all of the different programs and services."

Whitelaw, who also heads a Eugene-based financial consulting firm, said Dec. 21 has emerged as a "major date" that the team is shooting for, hoping by then to have their budget recommendations developed into a firm package for Roberts.

But all of this political hub-bub is nothing new for this professor. Whitelaw's involvement in politics dates back to working on one of Roberts' campaigns for her present position of secretary of state and helping out Gov. Neil Goldschmidt's transition team four years ago.

With so many irons in the political fire, is this professor a career politician in the making?

Definitely not, Whitelaw said. "I'm not interested in a political position; I have already expressed that. There is an absolute limit to this period of time."

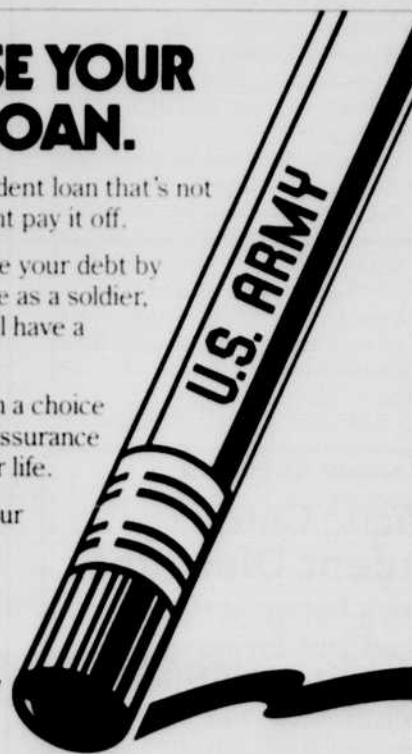
