"It's just sad that companies put so much emphasis on putting more money into their own pockets and not treating their workers fairly," Robinson said.

For the approximately 50 union workers who crossed the picket lines, Robinson said they have taken drastic pay cuts, faced hours reductions and lost benefits to keep their jobs.

He said the unemployed workers of Local 3035 are facing difficulty finding similar

jobs in the area because of timber shortages and the high rate of mill closures.

"In this Eugene/Springfield job market it's very difficult to find a job right now," Robinson said.

Most, he said, have found part-time work in the service industry — often for minimum wage.

The older workers and those with dependent families were hit hardest by the strike, while younger, single, common-laborers were more flexible and better able to find alternative employment, Robinson said.

Some of the former Nicolai workers have been forced to move to other states in search of more stable industrial economies, he said.

Despite this, the strong community support for the union and determination of its members throughout the long strike will continue to have a lasting effect on the community, Robinson said.

In the minds of the workers who stuck it out and fought for rights they believed were fair, Robinson said he thinks they would do it all again.
