The following week Colorado State clinched a winning season with a 31-13 win over Tulsa at home in Hughes Stadium, and much like Autzen Stadium the week before, the fans were going crazy in Fort Collins, Colo. hoping that the Rams could get a bowl bid for the first time since 1948.

"A week later," Andersen said, "Colorado State had cinched a winning season and were playing Tulsa after beating Wyoming. The fans on one side of the stadium were yelling 'Freedom' and the fans on the other side were yelling 'Bowl.'"

"They were genuinely excited about going to a bowl game also," he said.

Not only were the Ducks and Rams "genuinely excited" to be in the Freedom Bowl, they played a genuinely exciting game as well, which made Andersen's "practical approach" the right approach for Freedom Bowl VII.

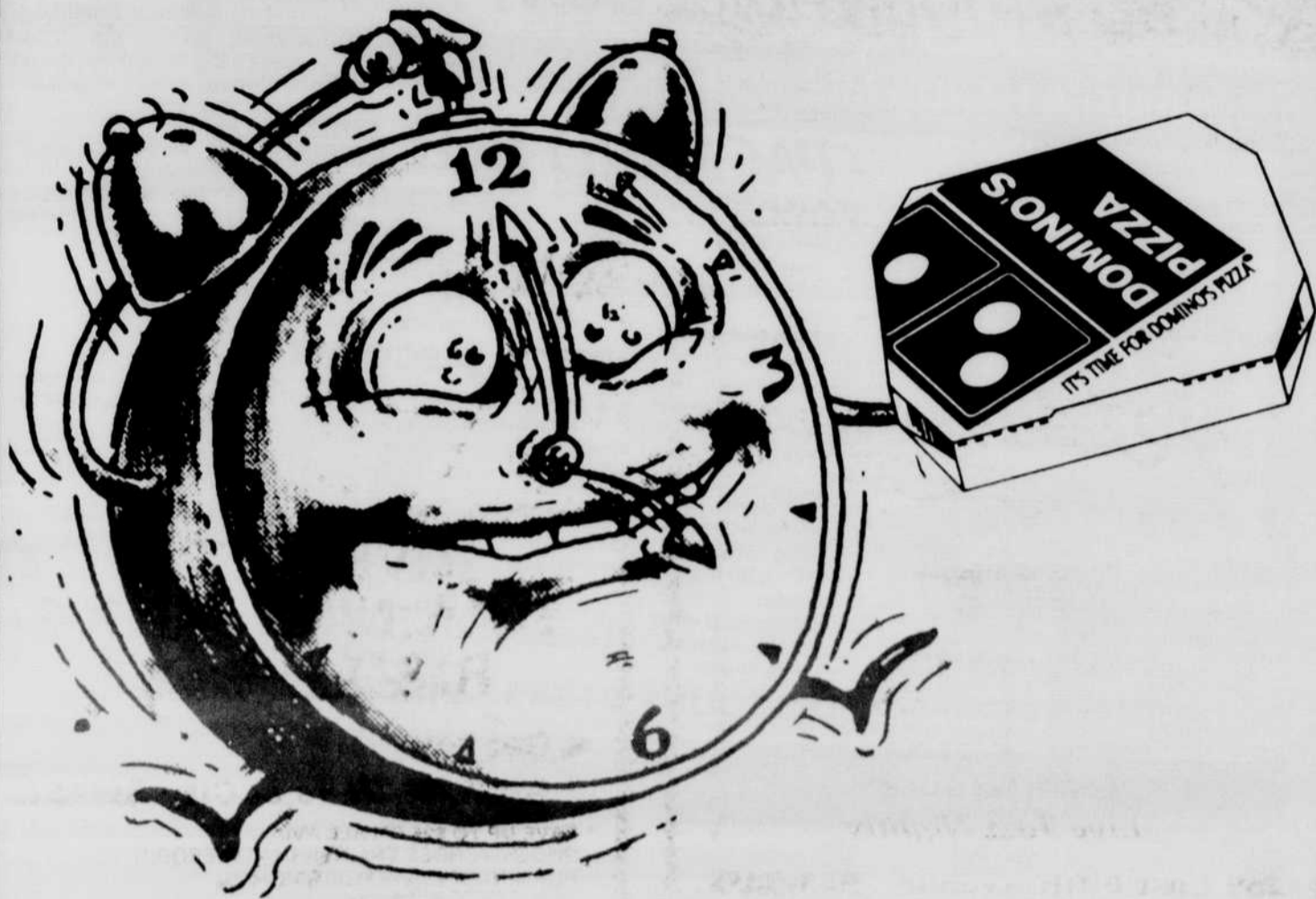
