Musgrave honored as Division I-A Academic All-American of the Year

Oregon quarterback Bill Musgrave received perhaps the most prestigious award of his college career back in December before the Ducks played in the Dec. 29 Freedom Bowl game.

Musgrave, who had earlier been named to the District VIII GTE Academic All-American football team, was named as the NCAA Division I-A Academic All-American of the Year.

The award is annually given to a student-athlete who "best represents the qualities of an Academic All-American by balancing the many elements of the life of a student athlete."

The school's all-time leading passer and Oregon's winningest quarterback ever, Musgrave

had a 3.46 grade point average entering fall term and graduated in December with a degree in finance.

The Academic All-American teams are selected by a vote of 1,600 college sports information directors across the country. A student-athlete must maintain at least a 3.2 GPA on a 4.00 scale to be eligible for the award.

Musgrave was named to the District VIII team on Nov. 28 along with teammates Andy Conner (junior outside linebacker) and Bud Bowie (junior offensive guard). Those three players also were named to the Pacific-10 Conference All-Academic team that was released last Friday.

Having already completed

his Oregon career, Musgrave will participate in three post-season senior all-star games.

Musgrave and split end Joe Reitzug will play in the Japan Bowl this Saturday and Musgrave will then go to Hawaii for the Hula Bowl (Jan. 19). Musgrave and teammate Peter Brantley will also be in the East-West Shrine Game Jan. 26 in Palo Alto, Calif.

Brantley, who missed the Freedom Bowl because of a strained left knee, will also play in the Senior Bowl on Jan. 19. He was originally scheduled to join Musgrave and Reitzug in the Japan Bowl, but team doctors didn't believe Brantley's knee would be ready for him to play in that game.

Two other Oregon football players received honorable mention recognition on the Pac-10 All-Academic team.

Junior outside linebacker Doug Douglass and junior offensive guard Mike Keeter both were honored by the conference. Douglass also received the honor last season and has a 3.00 GPA in general science while Keeter has a 3.08 GPA in marketing.

The Pac-10 also announced the cross country and volleyball All-Academic teams last Friday.
