"But they would never give us any specific complaint coupled with a time and place. How can you fight that kind of

Bailey said such specific information is not necessary for the ASUO to request a performance audit.

"The reason we decided on the audit is that we felt we didn't have enough information a make a decision (about contract renewal)," Bailey said.

"It's not a service I wanted to see go under," he added. "We were being as critical as we could be without being unreasonable.

The loss of money from University students, coupled with insufficient funding from other grants and contributors, forced the network to disband permanently, Holm said.

"We simply did not have the funds to continue operating," she said. "Money is tight out there. There aren't enough donations. Everybody wants the service, but there's not enough

Holm said board of directors has requested half of the \$11,700 allocated by the incidental fee committee for services the center rendered from July through December.

But because the network operated during that time without an ASUO contract, the organization is not legally entitled to any of the money, Bailey said. but one-third of the total has been offered.

"The ASUO felt that was a good faith offer," Bailey said.

Other crisis and counseling centers in the area are prepared to fill the void created by the sudden absence of Rape Crisis Network, which had served Eugene since 1977.

Shirley Wilson, acting director of the University's Counseling Center, said the center and

its nighttime crisis line will "fill in the gaps in available services until something else can be put in place.

The Counseling Center will temporarily expand its services for rape victims temporarily and respond to individual caller's needs as necessary, she said. The crisis line can be reached at 346-4488.

Wilson said she does not want the Counseling Center to become the only resource for students and hopes to work with the community to establish a new rape crisis center.

The University's Unwanted Sexual Behavior Task Force plans to discuss the issue at its meeting today at 12:30 p.m. in the EMU Walnut Room.

Whitebird Clinic, a 24-hour crisis and counseling center, is also responding by increasing rape counseling training of its staff, Whitebird Director Bob Dritz said. The Whitebird crisis line can be reached at
