Bruce Smith of the Northwest Afrikan Ballet Company. The company is noted by its audiences for the dancer's high-energy dance movements.

Also on Saturday, a World Beat Dance Concert at 7 p.m. will be opened by the local Eugene band, Moretime, followed by music from the Balafo Marimba Ensemble.

The World Beat Dance Concert is one of the few events during the celebration that charges an admission fee. Tickets are \$4 at the door for University students, \$6 for the general public, and \$2 for children age 10 and under.

On Sunday, a fellowship in the Willamette Hall Atrium will feature a speech about King by Dr. Quintard Taylor, a history professor at University. During the fellowship there will be gospel music and discussion of King's life.

"It's going to be a fun time as well as a spiritual time," Pearl Hill, director of Upward Bound and a member of MLKCC, said. "It will be an opportunity for the greater community to share with the University community."

To round out the week of celebration, Monday, Jan. 21 will be devoted to a conference for the community and students to learn about a wide selection of subjects.

There will be almost 20 sessions to choose from, all described inside the calendar listing the week's events.

Child care and sign language will be provided at the conference, when necessary.
