

Students shocked by news of war

Students who gathered around TV sets on campus Wednesday reacted with fear and disbelief to news that U.S. planes were bombing targets in Baghdad.

"I'm scared because I know guys over there," said Todd Hesse, a senior who joined about 25 others in front of the TV in the EMU Rec Center. "I didn't think it would happen this quick."

Graduate student Anthony Mattison said he had mixed feelings about using the military to force Iraqi President Saddam Hussein out of Kuwait.

"Part of me says, yeah, I'm glad to see that oppressive regime destroyed," Mattison said. "But a lot of Americans will die."

Senior Jeanne Rust said more effort should have been made to reach a diplomatic diplomatic solution.

"I can't believe they didn't have more talks," she said. "This only started five or six months ago."

College Republicans, President Garth Hernandez urged support for the U.S. troops now fighting a war in the Middle East.

"I may not agree with the way it was carried out or what happened," he said of the U.S. military strike, "but our first concern now should be about bringing our men and women home as soon as possible."

The news of the U.S. air strike was especially upsetting to Khaled Al-Jassim, a University student from Kuwait.

"I'm scared, I'm worried about it," he said in phone interview from his Eugene home. "This is a bigger mess than I expected."

Two other Kuwaiti students, friends of Al-Jassim, have left the University since the end of fall term to volunteer as interpreters for U.S. and allied

troops in Saudi Arabia.

Meanwhile, other University students began to discuss the possibility of a military draft if the battle to free Kuwait from Iraq is not completed swiftly.

"I'm afraid of a draft," said senior John Grunkemeier. "I want to think it (the war) will be short, but I don't believe that's right. It might take a while."

University President Myles Brand issued a statement Wednesday night calling for students and faculty members to "join in mutual comfort and support" during the uncertainty of war.

Brand also expressed concern for the eight University students who have been called to active duty in the National Guard or military reserves as part of Operation Desert Shield.

"We share the anxiety that their friends and families are experiencing, and all our hearts are with our men and women

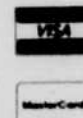
so close to danger in the Middle East," he said in the statement.
