Ducks drop road games to Huskies, Cougars

On first glance, a 10-point loss by the Oregon women's basketball team to 10th-ranked Washington might not appear to be too bad.

"If the game hadn't been broadcast (on KPNW, 1120 AM)," joked Oregon Coach Elwin Heiny, "no would have known how bad we played."

Although the final outcome was only a 65-55 loss to the Huskies, the Ducks were lucky it wasn't worse. They trailed 33-14 at halftime, 61-31 midway through the second half and shot only 29 percent from the floor (16 of 55).

Sunday's loss to Washington, coupled with a 76-72 defeat at Washington State on Friday, left Oregon at 3-9 in the Pacific-10 Conference and 10-12 over-

all.

While the loss to the Cougars broke Oregon's three-game winning streak Friday, the loss to the Huskies was even worse.

Karen Deden and Dianne Williams, Washington's inside duo, each scored 14 points, but did most of their damage early on, both offensively and defensively.

On the offensive end, each player had 10 points in the first half as the Huskies closed out the half on a 24-7 run after leading only 9-7 early on.

But their defense was more noticeable as Oregon freshman forward Debbie Sporcich had only six points, almost 10 below her average.

Oregon was also outrebounded 52-38, grabbing almost every missed shot, and there were plenty of those to grab.

Heiny said he was pleased the Ducks didn't give up and closed out the game on a 24-4 run.

The Ducks did get good guard play from Staci Wallenborn, who had 17 points and freshman Missy Stowell, playing before a hometown crowd. The Bellevue, Wash., native had 12 points, her best game in more than a month.

Against Washington State, it wasn't shooting but turnovers

that did the Ducks in.

Oregon shot 24 of 46 from the floor (52 percent) against the Cougars, but committed 29 turnovers.

The Ducks were also hurt by Darci Wellsandt, who scored a game-high 22 points and made six three-pointers, a Washington State school record.

Oregon guard Jennifer Bourn hit three three-pointers against the Cougars to break Michelle Eble's 1989 single-season record of 41. With two more treys against the Huskies, Bourn has 44 this season.
