come available because of the use of BANNER, the new student information system that will also offer University faculty and administrators increased accessibility to information, enhanced data security and compatibility with other data bases in the Oregon higher education system.

The BANNER Query System is designed for academic advisers and other University staff members who need access to student and course information from their office terminal or microcomputer.

Access will be given only to authorized users and they will be made aware what information is confidential.

Advisers and departments will eventually be rid of the reams of papers for each student. Looking up a record will merely be logging into DONALD (a Computing Center mainframe computer) and then into the BQS.

Computers not entirely out of reach


Lack of money can be one of the biggest roadblocks for people who want to enter another phase of technology and buy a personal computer. Computers aren't inexpensive.

But students are lucky. There is an opportunity on campus to buy brand-name computers below dealer costs. Apple and IBM offer discounts to students and faculty on many different models.

For example, compared with local dealers about \$200 can be saved on the new Macintosh Classic or Classic 40/2. About \$100 can be saved on an Apple ImageWriter II printer. Also, students can buy software for as much as 50 percent off the retail price.

These deals are all found in the Microcomputer Support Lab in Room 202 of the Computing Center. It is open Monday through Friday and has a wide variety of Macintosh and IBM computers on display. Questions are welcome and there are informational brochures.
