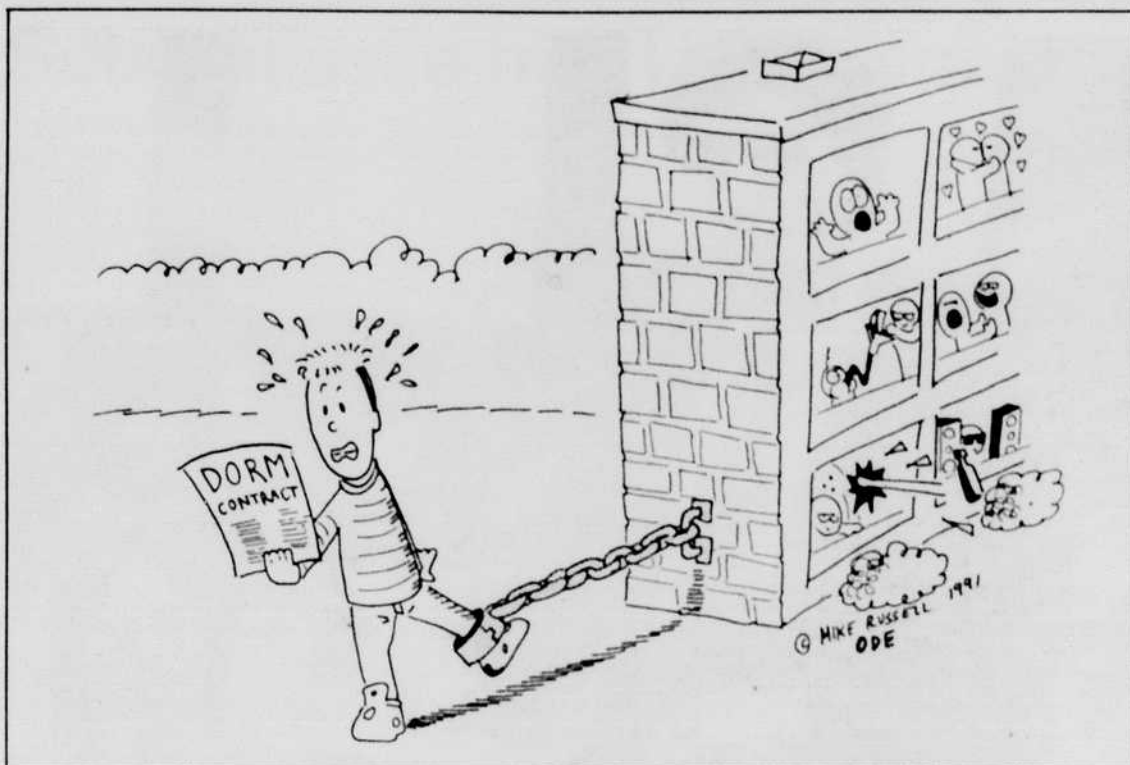

Dorm contract policy criticized

"A free case of the beverage of your choice" — the mark of desperate dorm residents eager to sell their dorm contracts.

The close of fall and winter terms mark the annual exodus of students from University dorms. Whatever their reasons, students are sometimes in a hurry to leave.

The problem is students sign a contract making them responsible for filling a vacant dorm room

after they find somewhere else to live. Students pay for their dorms by the term, but contracts are for nine months. If students move out mid-term, they pay on a pro-rated basis up until the day they move out. At this time, students are charged a \$1 a day until they find someone to buy their contracts.

University Housing's \$1-a-day rule is incentive enough for some to stay, but for Wilcox resident Michael Price, dorm living "gets on his nerves."
