Harris won the 100 meters in last week's dual meet win over Washington and joined McClendon, Bob Gray and Devon Hosey to turn in a scintillating

40.37 clocking in the 4 x 100-meter relay.

"We have a competitive group," Dellinger said. "We're not going to be conceding anything. Everybody out there will be doing their best."

While Dellinger and the Ducks might not be conceding anything, Dellinger isn't planning on doubling any of his distance runners.

Without Colin Dalton, Dellin-

ger is using Maris in the 1,500 because he needs Alan Foster to run the 800 along with Shannon Lemora.

"We're looking for marks and we're not going to try for the win by doubling people," Dellinger said.

Javelin thrower Art Skipper will likely compete for the Ducks, but if so, will only be able to throw from a standing position because of a sprained

ankle.

Heinonen has a relatively healthy team at his disposal with only Carol Holmen being held out of the meet. However, distance ace Stephanie Wessell had to pull up in the 1,500 against Washington because of a recurring knee injury.

"It's better," Heinonen said of Wessell's knee. "It buckled in the 1,500 and she stopped, and that was the smart thing to

do."

Indiana's Amy Legacki, the Big 10 indoor champ in both the 3,000 and 5,000, and Mary Beth Driscoll will challenge Wessell in the 5,000, but Heinonen isn't expecting a third straight meet record from Wessell in the event.

"She got a late start," Heinonen said, referring to Wessell's injury. "I don't know if she's racing ready."

Two Ducks who will have to be racing ready Saturday are sprinters Rosie Williams and Camara Jones.

Williams will run the 100 and 200 and will face two talented Tide sprinters in Tonya Lawson and Diane Francis.

Lawson has already clocked an 11.75 in the 100 this season and 13.50 in the 100 hurdles while Francis, last year's NCAA runner-up in the 400, has season bests of 11.77, 23.70 and 52.65 in the 100, 200 and 400, respectively. Jones will run in the 400 against Francis.

Some of the best women's action might be in the throwing events, though.

Indiana's Katrin Koch was third in the shot put and sixth in the discus at last year's NCAA meet, and teammate Angie Ryker was seventh in both events. Washington State will counter with Georgette Reed, who has already put the shot 52-5/8 outdoors and was fifth in the indoor shot at the NCAAs.
