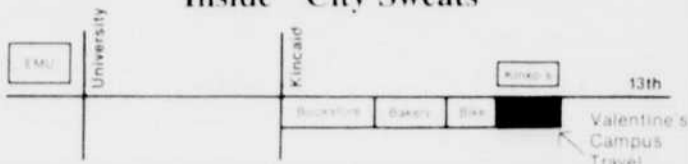

But opponents of reopening the mall said Roberts is ignoring ethical standards by making the proposal and planning to vote on it.

"The horrendous things here are the ethical aspects of Jack Roberts — he has such an obvious conflict of interest," said Ed Aster, who owns the Aster Building and the Equitable Building. Both are located on the mall.

Aster has fought the city since the proposal to reopen the mall was made last year.

County commissioners didn't raise the conflict of interest issue, but they did give a cool reception to Roberts' proposal.

Commissioners Jerry Rust and Steve Cornacchia were not available Thursday, but they were quoted in Thursday's *The Register-Guard* as being hesitant to support using county road funds.

Cornacchia said the county shouldn't appear to be playing a political role in the upcoming election, and Rust said it was premature to commit county money to a project that has yet to win approval.

Commissioner Ellie Dumdi, who was contacted by phone, said she will likely vote against the proposal.

"I represent a rural area of Lane County, and we have a lot of roads out there that need help," she said. "I don't want to jeopardize future projects with a project that doesn't have anything to do with the county."

Dumdi said she was also con-

cerned about the county spending road money on the mall when revenues are expected to decline. Road funds are raised through gasoline taxes and federal timber receipts.

Where the mall project's funding will come from promises to be a central campaign issue for each side, and some opponents claim Roberts is trying to manipulate voters by securing funds for the reopening.

In his defense, Roberts said the proposal will not affect the upcoming vote because the measure's opponents will not be persuaded to vote in favor of opening the mall.

"It certainly hasn't swayed Cynthia Wooten (spokeswoman for the Save the Mall Committee) or Ed Aster," Roberts said.

Roberts, who represents North Eugene on the board, said he is representing his district's interests by making the proposal, and that he would benefit only minimally if the mall is reopened.

"Even if I did (benefit), the voters will decide whether to open (the mall) or not," he said.

Aster, however, said Roberts is attempting to use the funds to cater to downtown special interest groups who are advocating the mall's reopening.

"You have these commissioners sitting on a \$40 million slush fund, and they're using it to push their own political interests," Aster said.

The measure's opponents have started lobbying commissioners to vote against the proposal, and Aster said the political battle will become more heated as next Wednesday's board meeting approaches.

## 'Millionaire's wife' dies of cancer

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP)

— Actress Natalie Schafer, known to generations of *Gilligan's Island* fans as the stranded millionaire's wife, Lovey, has died at age 90.

Schafer died Wednesday of cancer at her home, said family spokesman Frank Lieberman.

Schafer played the wife of Thurston Howell III, portrayed by the late Jim Backus. They were among the marooned passengers on the charter boat "Minnow."

Bob Denver starred as Gilligan. Other cast members included Alan Hale Jr., as skipper Jonas Grumby and Tina Louise as Ginger Grant.

The show originally ran on CBS-TV from 1964 to 1967, and remains enormously popular in reruns.

There also were three reunion TV movies: *Rescue From Gilligan's Island* in 1978, *The Castaways on Gilligan's Island* in 1979 and *The Harlem Globetrotters on Gilligan's Island* in 1981.

The actress was born in Red Bank, N.J., on Nov. 5, 1900, although various reference books place her age as young as 78.

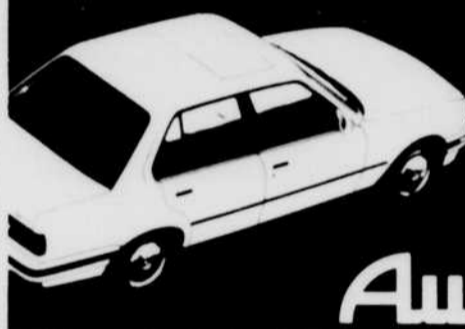
"She was always coy about her age, but she was really 90," Lieberman said.

Schafer also starred in the short-lived drama 1969-1970 series *The Survivors* with Lana Turner and Kevin McCarthy.

*Survivors* include longtime companion Maurice Hill, said Lieberman.
