

Education task force holding forum

The Task Force on Undergraduate Education will hold a public forum today from noon to 2 p.m. in the EMU Gumwood room to give the campus community a chance to offer comments and suggestions about the University's undergraduate program.

Some of the issues to be dis-

cussed by task force members and students at the forum include the formation of an educational policy committee, recruitment, admission and the academic experience of undergraduates.

The task force, created a year ago by President Myles Brand,

has felt "isolated" from the rest of campus and the forums offer a chance for members to exchange ideas with others, said Anne Leavitt, associate vice provost and task force member.

The task force must submit a report on its findings to Brand

by the end of May, Leavitt said. Another forum focusing on the undergraduate college experience will be held April 24 in the EMU Walnut room. At the second forum, non-academic issues will be addressed including campus diversity, campus life and student support services.
