# Musgrave drafted by Cowboys

Former Oregon quarterback Bill Musgrave was drafted in the fourth round of Sunday's National Football League draft when the Dallas Cowboys made him the 106th pick overall.

Musgrave had been projected by most NFL scouts and draft experts as going somewhere between the seventh and ninth rounds. Instead, he went as the seventh quarterback in the draft and ahead of such highly-touted quarterbacks as Miami's Craig Erickson and Virginia's Shawn Moore.

"My attorney, Leigh Steinberg, said I could go that high and I'm glad that happened," Musgrave said. "I'm really happy to be going to Dallas because they're an up-and-coming team and that is starting to show."

"I'm glad to be in the top group of quarterbacks," he said. "I think Dallas will be a fun place to live."

Oregon offensive coordinator Mike Bellotti was pleased that Musgrave went in the fourth round because there had been speculation he might slip as low as the 10th or 11th round.

"They must have liked what they saw," Bellotti said of the Cowboys. "I'm happy as heck for Bill and I just got off the phone with him and I know he's very excited and upbeat."

One factor that likely helped

Musgrave go as high as the fourth round was his performance in the post-season all-star games, where he was the most valuable player in the Japan Bowl and played on the winning teams in the Hula Bowl and the East-West Shrine Game. He completed touch-down passes in both the Hula Bowl and the Shrine Game.

Musgrave will leave Eugene Thursday for a three-day mini-camp with the Cowboys, a team that sorely needs quarterback help.

Starter Troy Aikman, the top pick of the 1989 draft from UCLA, went down with a shoulder separation at the end of the last season. Behind Aikman, the Cowboys have only journeyman Babe Laufenberg as a back-up.

"I know they'll have a few quarterbacks shooting for the job," Musgrave said.

Dick Mansberger, the Cowboys' director of college scouting, had seen Musgrave practice throughout the season, and Musgrave said he had been in contact with the Cowboys up
