UCLA wasn't the only first-ranked team the Ducks had to face this weekend. Portland State, the top-ranked team in Division II, swept Oregon in a doubleheader in Portland on Saturday, 4-2 and 6-5.

Brown said those two losses

will likely keep Oregon from returning to the NCAA Regionals.

"When a Division II team beats you two in a row, it shows your inconsistency. We're not going anywhere," Brown said. "I'm not being pessimistic, I'm being realistic."
