Bruins grab early lead in Pac-10 golf tourney

Playing in California-like weather and aided by the disqualification of an Arizona player, UCLA jumped out to a two-stroke lead in Monday's first round of the Ping/Pacific-10 Conference Women's Golf Championships at Eugene Country Club.

The Bruins carded a fourplayer total of 300 but didn't claim top honors until after the Wildcats' Susan Pankau was disqualified for signing the wrong scorecard. Instead of shooting a 299 and finishing a shot ahead of UCLA, Arizona carded a 302 and ended the day in second place, two shots behind the Bruins.

Arizona's Annika Sorenstam, a freshman from Stockholm, Sweden, toured the usually demanding Eugene course in twounder par 70, good enough for a three-stroke cushion over teammate Mette Hegeman, UCLA's Lisa Kiggens and Stanford's Jodi Figley in the individual competition.

Sorenstam, the nation's third-ranked player, was pleased with her round and said the nice weather had a lot to do with the low scores.

"I played well," Sorenstam said. "I liked the weather and the course. The course is different than we're used to because it's narrow and has a lot of trees."

Stanford (306) and Arizona State (308) are in the third and fourth place after 18 holes of play, while the host Ducks rounded out the top five with a 313

Washington (319), USC (321), Oregon State (329) and Washington State (331) rounded out the team scoring.

The Ducks accomplished what they set out to do by carding four rounds in the 70's. Oregon Coach Renee Mack said. Senior Lynn Yonemoto led the Ducks' parade with a 77 while Leigh Hornung fired a 78. Junior Starla Yamada, Oregon's top player, struggled to a first-round 81.

"Nothing dropped for me today." Yamada said. "I had no luck at all."

Mack was surprised by the low scores but pleased with the performance of her team, especially Yonemoto.

"Teams shot a lot better than I thought they would," Mack said. "My team played exactly the way we wanted to. They were very consistent and handled the pressure of playing in front of people.

"Lynn has played hard golf courses well under difficult situations before. She's a senior and this is her final tournament, so she's just going to go for it."
