'Funeral' mourns animal research

A small group of students braved the rain Wednesday afternoon to protest the use of animals in biomédical research and to celebrate World Laboratory Animal Liberation Day.

About 20 people from the Survival Center, Student Campaign for Disarmament and Students for the Ethical Treatment of Animals gathered in the EMU breezeway for an open-mike session on the animal research debate before marching to Johnson Hall.

Animal rights supporters were offset by a group of about 50 students and professors adscientific and medical research.

The protesters placed mock tombstones and a cardboard casket in front of Johnson Hall to symbolize the animal lives lost in biomedical research-

We wanted to do something symbolic and make people aware of the issue, and I think we did that even with a small group of people," said SETA member Todd Hausman.
