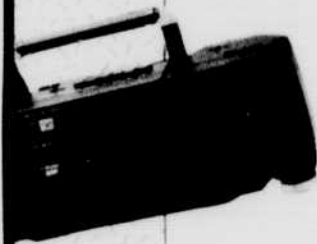

Guides offer help on recycling paper

Members of the University's Oregon Student Public Interest Research Group have completed work on two publications designed to educate the campus and the community about paper use and waste reduction.

OSPIRG revamped and expanded its 4-year-old Waste Reduction Guide to include new information and graphics on common household toxics and safe alternatives.

The publication, a yearlong project supported by OSPIRG and Lane County Waste Management, also provides statistics on recycling and tells consumers where they can take materials to be recycled.

The guide is available to the public and is distributed through the OSPIRG office in EMU Suite 1, Lane County Waste Management and at OSPIRG information tables.

Later this year, the guide will be available at the EMU publication rack, at attended Goodwill collection sites and at magazine racks in The Kiva and Sundance markets, as well as in major supermarkets.

"We want to make it available to everyone," said Rebecca Provorse, one of the students who worked on the Waste Reduction Guide.

OSPIRG also produced a brochure this year for professors and graduate teaching fellows that compares price information on course packets made from recycled vs. first-use paper and using one side vs. both sides of a packet page.

Provorse said the pamphlets have been distributed to campus departments, but for maximum effectiveness OSPIRG plans to redistribute them before packet orders are placed fall term.

OSPIRG member Becky Kelley said many professors continue to order packets printed on only one side of virgin white paper.

The project ideally will be put in place on every college campus with an OSPIRG chapter, she said.
