## Forum to discuss global issues

Enhancing University students' international perspective will be the focus of today's forum sponsored by the Task Force on the Global Context and International Studies.

The forum, titled "Global Perspectives and International Education at the University of Oregon," will be held in the EMU Walnut Room from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m.

"Clearly the world is becoming a smaller place and we're looking at what implications that should have for a major

public university," said economics Professor Joe Stone, task force member.

The task force has made several recommendations since it was created in winter 1990.

One recommendation is to create a residential and instructional International College on campus. The college would seek to foster awareness, understanding and respect of other cultures among students.

The International College would be a "wonderful opportunity" for University students from the United States and abroad to interact, said Karla Schultz, task force member.

"By living and studying to-

gether, American students and international students would break down barriers," Schultz said.

In addition, task force members suggested integrating study abroad programs into the academic curriculum.

The task force is also recommending that the University recruit and retain faculty with internationally oriented specialties.

Stone said he hopes forum attendants will not only provide reactions on the task force's recommendations but also offer additional ideas that may have been missed.
