DaSilva wins Pac-10 decathlon

Oregon's Pedro daSilva literally vaulted himself to the Pacific-10 Conference decathlon title Tuesday in Tempe, Ariz.

DaSilva won his second straight Pac-10 title with 7,782 points, vaulting past first-day leader Rod Zuyderwyk of Washington State by 41 points, largely because of a Pac-10 decathlon record 16-8 1/4 in the pole vault, the competition's eighth event.

Oregon's Muhammad Oliver also had an outstanding competition, scoring 7,709 points to gain an NCAA automatic qualifier and fourth place. Oliver's score smashed his old personal record of 7,407 points set at the Oregon Invitational.

The 1-4 finish by daSilva and Oliver gave Oregon the early lead in the Pac-10 track meet with 14 points.

The Ducks' Kelly Blair and Kamala Kohlmeier also had an outstanding two days, finishing second and fifth, respectively.

as Oregon tied UCLA for the early women's lead with 10 points.

Blair scored 5,404 points, a new PR and the third-best heptathlon in school history. Although Blair missed the NCAA automatic standard of 5,500 points, she likely moved high enough up the provisional list to make the NCAA meet.

Kohlmeier also had a PR with 5,110 points, bettering her old PR of 5,066 set at last year's Oregon Invitational. Kohlmeier also surpassed the NCAA provisional standard of 5,100 points.

Besides winning the pole vault, daSilva also had the best mark in the javelin with a toss of 187-2 and was second in the discus with a throw of 132-9.
