Ducks add NCAA meet qualifiers

Oregon's Rosie Williams got a reprieve to run again at Hayward Field.

The Duck senior sprinter, who holds school records in the 100 and 200-meter dashes,

was one of several Oregon tracksters who made the NCAA meet via the provisional qualifying list.

Williams had competed in the NCAA meet the past two seasons in the 200 and made the semifinals in that event last year. However, this season Williams had only a best of 23.86 in the 200, off the automatic and provisional times of 23.38 and 23.80, respectively.

Oregon Coach Tom Heinonen, who thought a time of 23.70 could have gotten Williams into the 200 field, said any provisional time would have made it.

"They went down the entire list and couldn't get enough qualifiers for prelim heats," Heinonen said, "so there will only be semifinals and finals."

And despite being ranked only 35th on the NCAA's list of automatic and provisional qualifiers with a wind-aided best of 11.71 in the 100, Williams made the field when it was announced Saturday night.

Heinonen said that because of a large number of scratches in the 100, Williams was able to get into that race.

"I was really surprised because they took more after the 35th spot," he said, "because there were three after her (Williams) that made it."

Williams wasn't the only surprising Duck who got in off the provisional list. Freshman Camara Jones made the meet in the 400 meters as did Laurel Roberts in the high jump.

As expected, Kelly Blair made the meet in the heptathlon and Nicole Woodward also made the field, but in the 5,000 meters, not the 10,000.

There really weren't any surprises among the Oregon men.

Bob Gray made the field in both the 110-meter hurdles and 400 hurdles and will be joined

by teammate Brian Wright in the latter. Distance runners Shannon Lemora and Colin Dalton were added in the 800 and 1,500, respectively, and Art Skipper was added in the javelin.

"I think everyone we were hoping to get in got in," Oregon men's Coach Bill Dellinger said.

Among the Ducks that did not make it were Nick Anastasiades in the hammer, Alan Foster in the 1,500, Marc Vanderville in the pole vault and the 4x100-meter relay team, but based on national rankings, Dellinger said he hadn't really expected them to make it.

It was a different story on the women's side, however.

Freshman Julie Beck seemed to be in good shape after setting a 164-10 personal record at last week's Les Steers/Last Chance Open, but didn't get in.

Heinonen said that likely is because the NCAA takes more provisional qualifiers in running events than field events.

"If they're taking more people, they're more likely to take them in the running events than the field events because it takes more time to run an event with more people in the field events," he said.

Dellinger is expecting all of his provisional qualifiers to have as good a shot at scoring in the NCAAs as the Ducks' automatic qualifiers.

"I feel good about our people who got in because they're coming on at the end of the season," Dellinger said. "All 11 guys can score and the only real question mark is Brian Wright."

"If all the rest are healthy, all have a good shot at scoring and even Brian Wright can score if he's ready to run."
