1991-92 Emerald news staff hired

After a week-long interviewing process, the *Oregon Daily Emerald* management team announced its 1991-92 news staff Tuesday.

"It was tough picking staff this year," said Christopher Blair, next year's editor. "Everyone who applied was qualified at least in some way. We got a good group of writers and editors, and the ones we didn't pick for staff will be freelancing. We'll have a good year."

Assisting Blair in this year's hiring process were Pat Malach, next year's managing editor, and Chris Bouneff, next year's news editor.

The biggest change in the *Emerald* next year will be on the copy desk. The addition of specialized copy editors, under the supervision of Bouneff, will add another dimension in qual-

ity control, Blair said.

Daralyn Trappe was named student government/activities associate editor, and will be joined by reporters Kirsten Lucas and Lisa Millegan. Trappe said beat coverage will include the ASUO and student groups, as well as greater emphasis on in-depth features and investigatory stories.

Rene DeCair will be the community associate editor, and will be joined by reporters Hope Neelson and Gerritt Koepping, with the prime focus being the role of the University in the Eugene area.

Carrie Dennett will be the higher education/administration associate editor, and will be assisted by reporters Dennis Fitzgerald and Colleen Pohlig. Blair said funding for higher education will be among the is-

ssues watched by the beat.

Jake Berg will run the sports desk, and will be assisted by reporters Jayson Jacoby and David Charboneau. Blair said the sports beat will go beyond just game coverage and will deal with such issues as how the University relates on the NCAA level.

Graphics editor Jeff Paslay will oversee the photo desk and will be joined by photographers Andre Ranieri and Jane Ballin. Blair said graphics will continue to play an important role as the *Emerald* strives for a more consistent look.

Layne Lakefish returns as entertainment editor, and Tammy Batey will be the news reporter.

Joe Kidd and Don Peters will team up to write editorials and oversee the letters and commentary sections.
