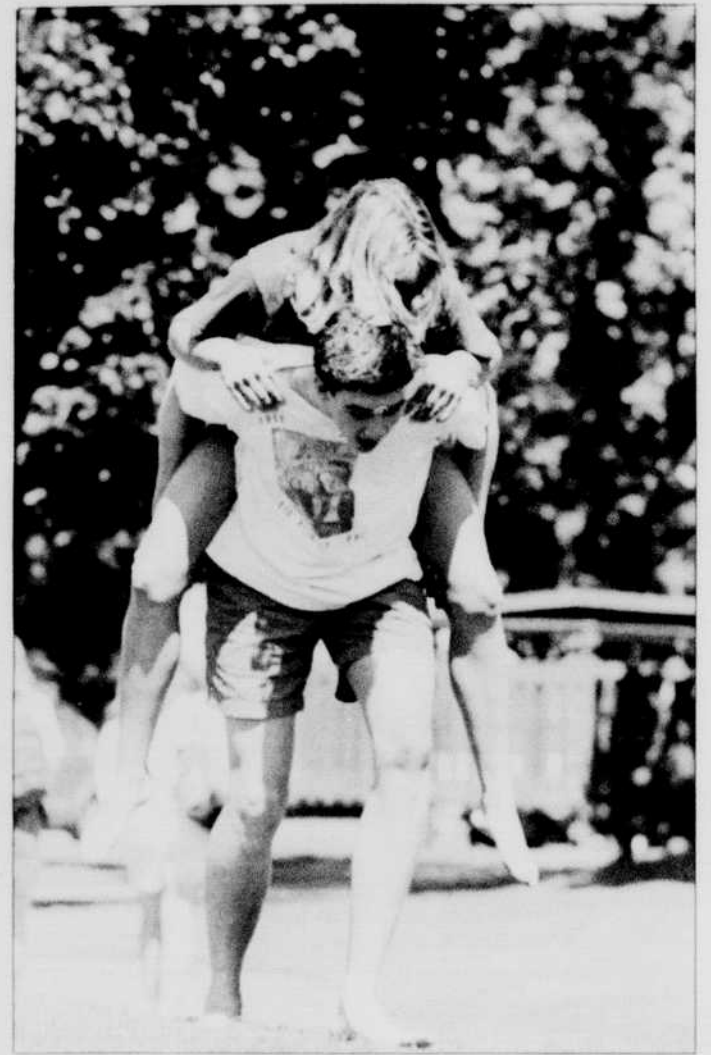

Explorer honored as outstanding graduate

University graduate Ann Bancroft, an explorer, educator and author who in 1986 became the only woman to reach the North Pole, is the recipient of the University's Outstanding Young Alumnas Award for 1991.

Each year, an outstanding young alumna is honored for achieving significant distinction in his or her professional or personal endeavors within 15 years of graduating from the University.

She will give a public talk and slide presentation that is free and open to the public in the Alumni Lounge of Gerlinger Hall at 1 p.m. today.

As a member of the Steger Expedition, Bancroft served as photographer and cinematographer for *National Geographic*. She is currently working on a book about the expedition and planning an all-women ski trek across Antarctica.

Bancroft earned her bachelor's degree in physical education from the University in 1981 and immediately began a teaching and coaching career in the Minneapolis public schools.

She was named *Ms.* magazine's Woman of the Year in 1987 and is also an active citizen-diplomat, working with a number of United States/Soviet exchange programs.
