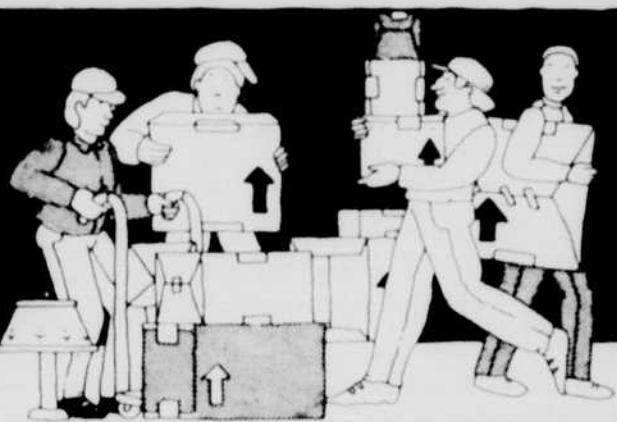

It was an easy day for Paula Berry in the javelin qualifying rounds at the NCAA meet Thursday.

Ducks almost perfect at NCAAs

A sore back and 61 hundredths of a second kept Oregon from having a perfect day at the NCAA Track & Field Championships Thursday.

Of the five Duck athletes competing in preliminary events at Hayward Field, only Nicole Woodward did not advance. Despite a pulled back muscle, the Oregon sophomore was still only 61 hundredths of a second from reaching Saturday's 5,000-meter run finals.

"I was so unsure of what would happen with my back," Woodward said. "I was just happy that I got here."

Oregon javelin throwers Paula Berry and Kim Hyatt, 100-meter runner Rosie Williams and 5,000 runner Lucy Nusrala all qualified for the next rounds.

Berry had throws of 190-10

and 190-5 to take first during the qualifying throws, and Hyatt's best of 172-1 was fourth among the throwers.

"I was real nervous today," Berry said, "but I feel a lot better now."

"When I stepped on the runway, I heard the crowd ... a total advantage to us," Hyatt said.

Williams qualified automatically for today's 100-meter semifinals by finishing fourth in her heat. The Oregon senior, who had only the 18th-best time of the NCAA field, ran to an 11.69 finish.

"I felt like I had nothing to lose and everything to gain because nobody was expecting anything of me," Williams said. "If I'm doing good, they'll know I'm doing good. If I'm doing bad, they won't care because I'm not even supposed to be out there."

Nusrala also automatically

qualified, finishing second in her preliminary with a 16:43.45 time.

"I kept telling myself, 'Get through this and there'll be Saturday,'" Nusrala said. "Saturday will be nice — I don't like to run qualifying races."

"She seemed completely under control," Oregon Coach Tom Heinonen said. "She can run with the big guns."

Kelly Blair, the only other Oregon athlete in Thursday's events, surprised herself by finishing sixth in the heptathlon with 5,377 points. Blair was 10th after the first four events Wednesday but ended strongly Thursday, including a second place in the javelin with a personal record throw of 142-8.

"I was really surprised because I was 10th (before)," Blair said. "I hadn't thrown (the javelin) in the 130s since I
