ASUO seeks to ease freshman transition

ASUO President Jennifer Bills and Vice President JoSonja Watson, who plan to devote much of their summer to student government, say they will spend part of it letting incoming freshmen know they can use the ASUO as a resource and how to become involved on campus.

Bills and Watson, who took office May 25, have several days set aside to speak with students taking part in the Early Orientation and Registration Program sessions throughout the summer. Moreover, the ASUO will sponsor an "open house" during many of the EORP sessions.

Watson said they hope to attract new students and to get them involved in the many student faculty committees.

Bills said she is pleased that students are already approaching the new ASUO Executive with questions and concerns.

"We want students to come to us with anything," she said.

"We've already had students come up and talk about problems."

In addition to outside concerns, the two are at work on internal business.

Watson is currently working with comptrollers to reorganize the way ASUO financial records are kept to create a more organized and efficient method of record-keeping.

Therese DuBravac, ASUO programs coordinator, is in the process of revamping the programs council. Bills said the council, made up of the directors of student programs, has generated little interest in the past. DuBravac is working to make the council more effective, Bills said.

She also said the ASUO is remaining active in Salem. Several students, including Bills, went to Salem to lobby against a House bill that would have limited student use of state vans. The bill died in the transportation committee. Bills said the ASUO will continue to act as a "watchdog" in state issues pertaining to students.
