music school, is the Principal Tuba Player of the Festival Orchestra.

The orchestra is composed of players from the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra, the Eugene, Denver and Oregon symphonies, as well as Members from European orchestras in Frankfurt, Hanover, Munich and Stuttgart.

Originally from Texas, Frazier traveled internationally for 15 years with the Chicago Chamber Brass before settling down in Eugene last fall. He is involved with the chamber ensemble and gives brass lessons at the University.

Frazier and the rest of the Festival Orchestra performed at

the opening ceremony for the Bach Festival at the Hult Center Plaza on Sunday.

"It was fun to see how interested the people were," Frazier said. "They were interested in getting into the spirit of the Bach Festival right from the start."

Frazier said he enjoys this event "because it brings together different people from the community with students. It's very populist music. It involves and entertains people from all walks of life."

Frazier said Bach has always been a personal favorite.

"You can appreciate how his music is crafted," he said. "The architecture of his music is impressive. Themes fit together, modulations fit together, yet you can understand it just by listening to the sheer beauty of the music."

The Festival Orchestra, featuring Frazier, will be playing works by Mozart, Franz Schubert and Mendelssohn on Wednesday at the Hult Center's Silva Concert Hall. Programs with complete listings of other events are available at the music school.

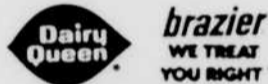

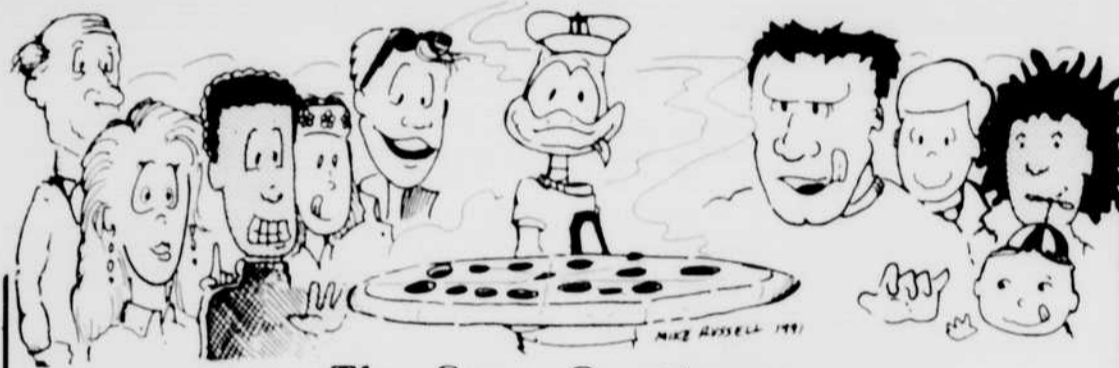
