Stolz to run marathon at games

University graduate student Bob Stolz, a former runner at Purdue University, will represent the United States in the marathon in the World University Games in Sheffield, England.

The games begin Friday and run through next Thursday. The men's marathon will be run Sunday.

Stolz was added to the U.S. team at the end of the June and hopes the student games could lead him into the 1992 Olympics in Barcelona, Spain.

"I would love to do the Olympics and this is just like the Olympic Games, so who knows?" Stolz said.

Stolz has run only one marathon this year, setting a personal record of 2 hours, 21 minutes, five seconds at Columbus, Ohio. He just missed the Olympic Trials qualifying time of 2:20.00 "in the last mile."

Despite running only one marathon this year, Stolz led a marathon in Kakejawa, Japan, last year for 23 miles only to "bomb at the end."

"The travel, heat and humidity just finally took their toll," he said.

Stolz, 26, just made the cut-off for the student games as competitors must be in a college or university, but not older than 27 years of age.

Stolz graduated from Purdue with a degree in mathematics and is pursuing his MBA at Oregon. He ran both cross country and track for the Boilermakers, but never really enjoyed a successful season in either one.

He never qualified for an

NCAA outdoor track meet. Stolz did compete in the 1987 NCAA cross country meet, finishing in 33rd place.

Unlike other events in track and field where qualifying for the U.S. team was determined by individual finishes at The Athletics Congress national

championships, marathon participants were picked by past winning performances and meeting the necessary qualifying time.

"I didn't even know if they knew about me, but I guess they kept my file on hand at TAC," Stolz said.

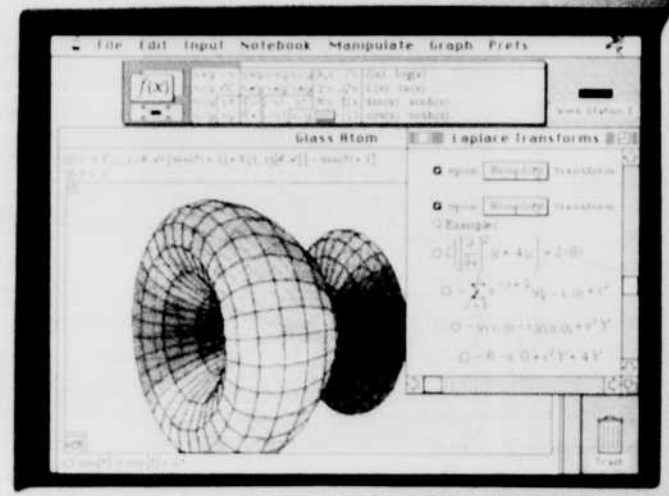
