McGee wins hammer at festival

Berry spears third-place finish at World University Games

Two former Oregon track stars won their respective events at the U.S. Olympic Festival this past weekend at Drake Stadium on the UCLA campus.

Hammer thrower Scott McGee won his event and Liz Wilson took the 3,000-meter title as the Olympic Festival concluded at various sites throughout the Los Angeles area.

McGee, the 1990 NCAA champ and the NCAA runnerup this past season, won the hammer with a toss of 225-4, his second-best throw ever.

Wilson, who used up her track eligibility in 1990 and completed her final cross country season this past fall, won the 3,000 meters in a time of 9:21.35.

Two others with Oregon track ties also competed at the Olympic Festival.

Bob Gray, the NCAA runnerup in the 110-meter high hurdles this past season, finished fifth in that event at the Olympic Festival, clocking 13.99.

Rosie Williams, the school record-holder in the 100 and 200-meter dashes, ran on the bronze medal, third-place West 4x100-meter relay team that clocked 46.61. Williams completed her Oregon career at the NCAA meet.

Several other University athletes also competed quite suc-

cessfully at the festival in sports other than track

Julie Cavanaugh, a first-team all-American for the Oregon softball team this past season, was on the gold medal winning West softball team, and Sarah Johnston, an 18-year-old sophomore at Oregon, was part of the victorious North water polo team that upset the East 11-10 on Sunday.

In basketball, Debbie Sporcich and Sara Wilson, freshmen at Oregon last season, were on the bronze medal West basketball team. Jordy Lyden was on the men's West hoop

squad, but the West team finished fourth and did not medal.

Meanwhile, at the World University Games in Sheffield, England, Ken Flax, the 1986 hammer champ at Oregon, bested the field with a toss of

Also at the World University Games, Paula Berry, the 1991 NCAA javelin champ, captured a bronze medal with a third-

Berry was back in eighth place for most of the competition but unleashed a throw of 191-2 on her final toss to move
