Former Ducks meet in scrimmage

PORTLAND — Two former Oregon football players celebrated a homecoming of sorts Friday night when the Scattle Scahawks and the Atlanta Falcons played an exhibition scrimmage here at Civic Stadium.

Former Duck stars Chris Miller, now playing quarterback with the Falcons, and Derek Loville, a running back for the Seahawks, played in Friday's scrimmage in front of 22,592 fans.

The scrimmage, consisting of a kicking exercise, seven-on-seven drills and one-on-one line drills, ended with each team running 20 fullspeed plays for the first, second and third string units.

The Seahawks won the scrimmage 24-18 with their last score coming on a four-yard touchdown run by Loville.

Miller, who is returning to the Falcons after missing the last three games of last season because of a broken collar bone, completed six of 11 passes for 82 yards and a touchdown, including a 52-yard strike to all-pro receiver Andre Rison.

Loville got extra playing time because John L. Williams and Derrick Fenner, Seattle's starting running backs, are not yet in camp due to contract problems.

But Loville said the two players' absence wasn't a factor in his game.

"I'm just doing my job," Loville said. "Basically, I'm worried about Derek. I'm going into camp and I'm working hard every day, two times a day.

"I'm not worried about who's in camp and who's not in camp. I'm just competing against myself trying to get better."


Loville, who is entering his second year in the NFL, said having a year's experience under his belt is a big advantage.

"It's pretty much the same competition," Loville said, "but I'm more confident and relaxed. Chris (Miller) is even more relaxed.

"We're pretty good friends and we were talking about it earlier today. It's going a lot smoother because we're veterans and we know what to expect and we know the offense."

Miller can expect some tough competition for
