called Byrne a "redneck" and an "art basher" in comments printed in the Aug. 16 edition of the Eugene Register-Guard. A compromise was reached, by which damage incurred to the sculpture will be repaired and moved to another place near the building.

**Schools keep suspect cash**

The Oregon State System of Higher Education is keeping a \$1 million endowment from the Sasakawa Peace Foundation despite controversy surrounding its founder's reputation. When the state system accepted the endowment from the Japanese foundation in March, questions arose about receiving money from the foundation established by Ryoichi Sasakawa, a former war-crimes suspect with reputed connections to organized crime.

"There seems to be some suggestion that because of (Sasakawa's) politics, the money is suspect," said Greg Parker, the state system communications director. "Because of the budget constraints, we're going to be taking money from any legitimate source."

**Report recommends changes**

A faculty committee report substantiates many of the complaints and concerns of students participating in a University study abroad program, and recommends changes in the way the program is run and evaluated.

The Perugia (Italy) Study Abroad Program, which offers students the opportunity to

man, this year's ASUO publications coordinator, will be the ASUO representative; John Thomas will be the Student Senate representative. One other student, an IFC member, will be appointed and the remaining



spend a summer attending university classes in central Italy, drew the attention of the University administration in March after complaints about housing and the unstructured nature of its coursework.

The investigation drew more attention in May after the program's director and founder, Professor Emmanuel Hatzantonis, committed suicide.

The report recommended that the responsibility of finding housing be shifted from the director to students, and that participants negotiate directly with landlords "in Italian, we hope!" it stated parenthetically.

The report also states that the Perugia program and other study abroad programs are not properly supervised by the University, and that the Office of International Affairs should have ultimate administrative jurisdiction over all University study abroad programs.

Joe Stone, a committee member and professor of economics, said the report emphasizes the need for formal University re-

view. Student evaluations and reports from faculty directors are currently the minimum requirement of all state system program evaluations. The report also recommends that the University Senate's Faculty Studies Committee should review all study abroad programs on a five-year cycle.

**Assaults reported**

Several assaults Aug. 3 and 4 in the West University neighborhood prompted the Office of Public Safety to join forces with the Eugene police department in an effort to avoid further incidents.

OPS has posted fliers on campus and in the West Eugene area, warning people to take precautions and be on the lookout for a suspect described as a white male, 20 to 25 years old, five-foot-eight, 160-180 pounds with wavy, collar-length hair.

At least three assaults occurred; two of them were sexual assaults.

seats will be filled through a hiring committee made up of student group representatives.
