To complement the beer and wine offerings, Taylor's will soon be serving pastas and other foods.

Another college hot spot is **Rennie's Landing**, located on 1214 Kincaid. Wood tables and chairs give the place a nautical, New England flair. An upstairs deck draws heavy crowds in the summer and spring.

Rennie's is a great place to relax and drink your beverage of choice, but it also has an impressive food menu. Sandwiches, soups, salads, vegetarian entrees and some of Eugene's best burgers are served.

They sell domestic beer at \$1.75 and imported at \$2.50 per bottle. Pitchers are \$4, or you can get a pounder for \$1.40 or a glass for \$1.

At 550 E. 13th St., **New Max's** is also close to campus. It looks like a hole in the wall, but has a wonderful reputation. This is one of the oldest taverns in Eugene. Posters from local bands decorate one of the walls. Beer mirrors and plastic toys decorate the other.

Atmosphere is the key word here. You could call it cozy, or you could just say it is small enough to hear the music from the stage in the back corner. The music varies between acoustic, rock, punk, blues and alternative.

New Max's offers a variety of bottled beers. Beer runs \$1/glass, \$1.50/pint,

and \$3.95/pitcher. On Miller Monday, beer is \$1/pint or \$1 for 12 oz. long neck bottles.

The crowd you'll find at New Max's changes with the type of music being performed.

One of the busiest places you'll find near campus is **Guido's**, 801 E. 13th Ave.

This place has all the trappings of a stereotypical '70s disco meat market. Mirrors surround the sunken dance floor so it is easily seen. The DJed dance music is loud. Bright flashing lights continually swirl above the customers (especially near the dance floor).

A tile floor by the bar and a high A-frame ceiling accent the decor. Besides drinking and dancing, Guido's keeps pa-

trons entertained with a pool table and several video games.

Guido's is open from 11 a.m. to 2:15 a.m. It has an extensive menu specializing in Italian food like calzones and pizza. Sandwiches run about \$4. Beer is \$1/glass and \$3.50/pitcher.

For a change of pace from rock, top-40, punk or alternative live music, **Jo Federigo's** is located across from the 5th Street Market, 259 E. 5th Ave. Take the stairs down to the lower level and treat yourself to a night of good jazz. Live jazz is featured nightly, and Mark Alan plays on Sunday.

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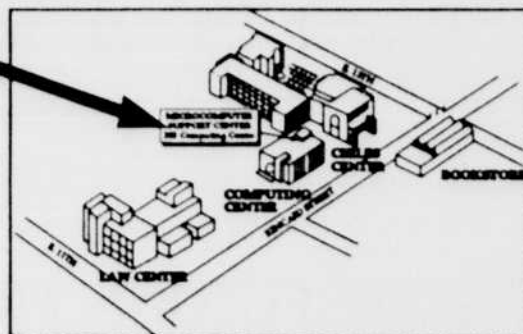
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
