BALTIMORE (AP) - Doctors at Johns Hopkins Hospital removed a 180-pound ovarian cyst from a 40year-old West Virginia woman, a hospital spokeswom-

"That is abnormally, abnormally abnormal," said Dr. Raymond Kaufman, chairman of the obstetrics-gynecology department of Baylor College of Madison in Madison, Texas. "That's a rarity."

There are different types of ovarian cysts, but unless the patient is extremely obese, most can be detected with a pelvic exam when they are 3 or 4 centimeters in diameter and "a couple of grams" in weight, he said.





The girl was arrested at her home without a struggle. waived her rights and gave a taped statement to police detective Randy Mullinax in which she said she intended to kill Hood.
