## Top state golfer tied for second

The Ducks' top finisher after the first day at the Oregon Women's Golf Invitational is actually not playing as part of the team.

Nancy Crawford, playing as an Oregon individual at the invitational, is tied for second place overall and is the top Oregon competitor after Monday at the Vancouver, Wash., tourney, hitting a 75 on the par-74 course for a three-way tie. Senior Starla Yamada, in a fourway tie for fifth place overall, leads members of the Oregon team with a 77.

UCLA, defending NCAA champions and second at the invitational a year ago, leads the team scoring with 308. Arizona State is second at 314, Oregon State is third with 317 and the host Ducks are fifth with

Arizona won the tournament last year, but the Wildcats are not competing this year. Oregon finished fifth overall last

Leading the individual race is Jenny Park of UCLA with a sparkling 71. Tied for second with Crawford are Lisa Walton of San Jose St. and Tricia Konz of Arizona State.

Crawford, a senior out of Elk Grove, Calif., was one of three entrants listed under the Oregon individuals entry
