## Netters drop in both polls

A pair of home losses over the weekend dropped the Oregon volleyball team a spot in both national polls Tuesday.

The Ducks, 10-4 overall and 0-2 in the Pacific-10 Conference, fell from 18th to 19th in both the Tachikara/AVCA Volleyball Poll and Volleyball Monthly poll. Losses to second-ranked UCLA and tenth-ranked USC at McArthur Court gave the Oregon its first two losses of the Pac-10 season.

The Tachikara and Volleyball Monthly polls both rank Stanford and the Bruins first and second in the nation, respectively, but the two polls flip on the third and fourth spot. Tachikara says Long Beach State is third and Pacific is fourth, and Volleyball Monthly says the opposite. Tachikara gives the fifth spot to Hawaii, and Volleyball Monthly lists Louisiana State as fifth.

Washington is the only other Pac-10 team in either poll, ranked 20th by Tachikara.

Oregon also makes an appearance in Tuesday's NCAA Division I Men's Cross Country poll. The Ducks are ranked fourth in the poll after taking third at the Emerald City Invitational in Seattle last weekend.

Ranked ahead of Oregon is Arkansas in first, Iowa State in second, and Texas in third. Notre Dame holds the fifth spot in

Arkansas earned 425 voting points for the top, and Oregon grabbed 361.

Other Pac-10 schools making an appearance in the poll are Arizona at ninth, Washington at 14th, and Washington State

## Duck golfer takes fourth

Oregon's Jeff Lyons tied for fourth place at the Wolf Pack Classic Golf Tournament held Monday and Tuesday in Dayton, Nev.

Lyons shot a 145 during the first two rounds and a 220 over the final three rounds Tuesday for a four-way fourth-place tie in the individual race.

The Oregon team was sixth overall in the team standings at the Wolf Pack Classic with a 911 total.

Doug DuChateau was the only other Oregon competitor finishing in the top thirty. He shot a 157 on Monday and a 229 Tuesday for a three-way 23rd-place tie.

Winning the overall team race was Pacific, pacing the field with an 885 stroke total. Nevada was a mere two strokes behind for second place, shooting 887.

Pacific's Brian Wear shot a 214 for the individual championship. His 2-under-par score beat out second-place Dave Schneider of San Diego State, who shot 217 during the two days.


