

PGE conducts Trojan nuclear plant disaster drill

SALEM (AP) — The safety of the Trojan nuclear power plant was addressed on two fronts Tuesday, as state officials began a disaster drill and two groups asked regulators to investigate costs of fixing the plant's steam generators.

The two-day exercise by Portland General Electric Co. and government agencies isn't the result of the generator problems.

It's a regular yearly practice session to test emergency response systems and plans, said Bill Sanderson, spokesman for the state Department of Energy.

The exercise is being monitored and graded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency as well as the federal Nuclear Regulatory Commission. FEMA examines the plan once every two years, Sanderson said.

The federal emergency agency "will make it very clear where we are to improve" if the state's performance shows deficiencies, Sanderson said.

Meanwhile, two organizations said at a Portland news conference that they are asking the state Public Utility Commission to investigate and hold hearings on costs of repairing or replacing steam generators at the plant near Rainier.

"This inquiry is necessary to protect ratepayers before Portland General Electric enters into contracts for new steam generators at Trojan," the Don't Waste Oregon Committee and the Citizens Utility Board said in a joint statement.

PGE is testing defective steam generator tubes at the plant near Rainier to determine whether it can resume operation as scheduled Nov. 4.

The Don't Waste Oregon Committee sponsored an initiative measure that was defeated by voters last year that would have shut down the Trojan plant.

The committee said the PUC last year refused to consider costs of steam generator replacement as part of analysis of the economic impact of shutting down Trojan.
