Health center gets new directors

The Student Health Center is starting the school year with two new administrators.

Gerald Fleischli started work as director of the health center on Aug. 16 and Weston Morrill began heading the University Counseling Center on Aug. 15.

Fleischli, 51, was medical director of the University of Nebraska's health center for almost 10 years. He replaces Dr. James Jackson, director since 1979. Jackson resigned to practice as a health center physician.

Morrill moved from Salt Lake City, where he was the counseling center director at the University of Utah for 13 years.

Fleischli said, "I found the (University) Health Center to be absolutely outstanding." Looking at the staff and their qualifications, the student opinion surveys and the range of services — it's all very impressive."

Fleischli said he is interested in what the future has in store for medicine and the University community.

"Given this excellent program, I guess the question would be what is there to do," he said. "And my current thinking is what we need to be doing is planning for the long term."

"We are trying to develop plans with contingencies to see where we will be in the year 2000," Fleischli said.

He plans to develop a committee with students that will delve into some issues that the University may face in the future.

Fleischli's responsibilities include development and implementation of clinical health services; planning program, budgeting and coordinating health center services with those offered

by the Eugene medical community, and various campus groups.

He said he does not believe Measure 5 will have a direct effect on the health center. However, he intends to scrutinize the whole program to ensure that it is operating as efficiently as possible.

Fleischli, who received his medical degree in 1967 from Stanford Medical School, will receive \$82,500 annually for his work.

Morrill, the new director of the Counseling Center, said he chose the University because of fond childhood memories of Eugene and his impression of the health center staff.

"There are some really good people on the staff and I felt I could make a contribution," he said. "I am impressed with the efforts the staff makes to help the students have a positive university experience."

"This is a safe place for diversity and I value that," Morrill added.

Due to Measure 5, the Counseling Center will lose one senior counselor after this academic year. Morrill, 56, has some ideas on how to minimize the impact.

"We are going to put an emphasis on group programs and try to be efficient in getting people into the program," he said. "Our challenge is to make the best use of our resources but there will be limitations."

Morrill, who replaced retired director Shirley Wilson, received a doctoral degree in counseling psychology from the University of Missouri, Columbia, in 1966. His annual salary is \$62,000.

One of Morrill's plans to improve the Counseling Center is to have the counselors see the students for their first visit on a drop-in basis instead of putting their names on a waiting list.
