## WPPSS nuke plant back on line

RICHLAND, Wash. (AP) — The state's only commercial nuclear power plant has resumed operations after a fifth and final control crew passed qualifying tests.

The Washington Public Power Supply System Plant No. 2 was originally shut down in April for annual maintenance. Its July 1 restart target was delayed twice because some of its operating crews failed requalification tests given by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. Operations resumed Wednesday.

"Saturday morning we will begin generating electricity," WPPSS spokesman John Britton said Thursday. "It will take five days to get up to full power."

The fifth crew passed its test Wednesday and restart procedures began almost immediately at the 1,100-megawatt plant.

Troubles began in March, when 15 of the 40 opera-

tors failed the NRC exams. The NRC allowed the plant to operate until its scheduled shutdown.

Two crews failed again in June, and WPPSS officials decided to revamp their emergency procedures training program, Britton said.

In early September, new tests were given and four of the five crews passed. Members of the fifth crew passed individual written and verbal tests, but failed to satisfy the NRC during simulated accidents.

## Reservoir concerns environmentalists

SALEM (AP) — The federal Bureau of Land Management is proceeding with construction of a livestock watering reservoir in southeastern Oregon despite warnings from state water officials that filling the reservoir is illegal without a permit.

Construction of the Willow Butte Reservoir and piping system began in early August.

The Water Resources Commission received the permit application Aug. 16, but has not granted it. Environmental groups have asked the state agency not to approve any new water withdrawals in the area to conserve stream flow for a threatened species of cutthroat trout.

David Atkins, manager of the BLM's Jordan Valley Resource Area, asked the state to allow construction of the Willow Butte Reservoir and piping system. The system is part of a project to allow the nearby Whitehorse Ranch to continue grazing cattle in the basins.

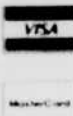
At a Water Resources Commission hearing Wednesday, Atkins confirmed the construction of the reservoir was well under way.

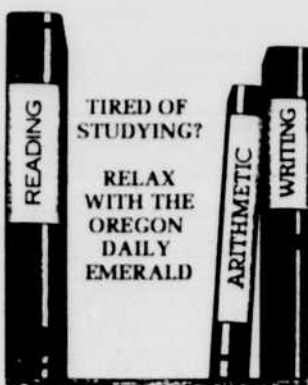
